Angus Glen to Redesign North Course with Mackenzie & Ebert Following 2026 Season

Iconic Markham course to transition from 18 holes to a newly designed 9-hole design, with completion targeted for Spring 2027.

Markham, ON — Angus Glen Golf Club will undertake a redesign of its North Course following the 2026 season, transitioning the current 18-hole layout into a newly designed 9-hole course scheduled to open in Spring 2027.

As part of ongoing development in the area, activity is currently taking place on land adjacent to the North Course. The course itself will remain fully open and unchanged throughout the entire 2026 season, with redesign work beginning following the season.

The project will be led by internationally acclaimed golf course architects Mackenzie & Ebert, the firm behind the acclaimed renovation of the South Course ahead of the 2015 Pan American Games.

The announcement comes as the North Course marks its 25th anniversary, having opened in 2001 as part of Angus Glen's continued evolution as one of Canada's leading public golf facilities.

"The North Course has been an important part of Angus Glen's identity for more than two decades," said Cailey Stollery. "As we celebrate its legacy, we're also looking ahead. Working again with Mackenzie & Ebert allows us to honour the spirit of the course while shaping a golf experience that reflects the future of the game."

"We're pleased to return to Angus Glen," said Martin Ebert, co-founder of Mackenzie & Ebert. "The North Course has a well-established identity, and our approach will focus on refining the routing to improve playability and flow while retaining its core character."

Celebrating 25 Years of the North Course

Since opening in 2001, the North Course has played an important role in the story of Angus Glen, welcoming golfers from across Canada and around the world.

Angus Glen has earned international recognition for its championship golf, including hosting the Canadian Women's Open and the TELUS Skins Game in 2001 on the North Course, the Canadian Open in 2002 on the South Course and again in 2007 on the North Course, and serving as the golf venue for the 2015 Pan American Games.

Throughout the 2026 season, Angus Glen will commemorate this milestone with a special “Farewell to the North” campaign, featuring tournaments, storytelling initiatives, and opportunities for golfers to enjoy the course in its current form one final time.

Project Overview

- The North Course will remain fully open throughout the 2026 season, with construction beginning following the season.
 - The redesign will focus on improving routing, playability, and overall course flow, while maintaining the character of the existing layout.
 - The new North 9 is expected to open in Spring 2027.
 - The South Course will remain an 18-hole championship course.
